Once again this year, we will be working hard as a school to support our three chosen charities—the East Riding Foodbank, Young Minds and Christian Aid. On the morning of our Harvest Service (Friday 3rd October), we are inviting all children to bring donations of food for the food bank to church.




### Y6 'Large School' Boys Football Competition


