Breakfast and After School Club – Reminders

At the end of the summer holidays, we wrote to all parents and carers to share the results from our wraparound survey. We explained that in response to this survey, we had extended after school club so that there is now a 5:45pm finish time and that we would review demand and uptake over time. So far this term, So far, this term we have had very few children who have stayed at after school club beyond 5.30pm. We will continue to monitor pupil collection times, to check the viability of this later finish time, and will update you if we are going to make any adjustments to our timings.

In this letter we also explained that the prices for both Breakfast and After School Club will increase from January and that we will inform parents and carers of the updated pricing structure in December. The price increases are being implemented as the costs to run the wraparound provision continue to increase (for example food costs continue to rise) and improving resources, increasing capacity and extending hours do have a cost attached to them (immediate and ongoing). As we outlined, we have been able to delay these price increases because of the grant that we have received and the school budget subsidy and the price of clubs has therefore been frozen during the Autumn term (even though an extra 15 minutes is available daily in after school club). Please rest assured that we will do everything we can to keep this vital wraparound care affordable for parents and carers.

This year, we are once again encouraging families in our community to support the Jacob's Well Christmas Shoebox Appeal.

Please could all shoeboxes be brought into school by Tuesday 16th December.


