#### Consultation for the admissions arrangements for 2027/28

You may be aware that falling pupil numbers is a national issue which local authorities are needing to respond to. Our Local Authority has control over the admission arrangements for schools within the East Riding and currently, within the county, there is a high level of surplus places.

Over the last few years, a number of local schools have had their admission numbers reduced in order to manage the supply of school places. The Local Authority has informed us that there will be a consultation for the admissions arrangements for our school for the academic year 2027/28 with the view to reduce the PAN (Published Admission Number) from 60 places to 45. The consultation will take place between 8th October and 26th November 2025. Prior to the consultation going live, the Local Authority will provide us with information that we will publish on our website. This will include a link to a consultation survey that you can complete.

This proposed change will not affect any pupils currently in school. Should the proposal to reduce the PAN at St Mary's be approved, this will not come into force until September 2027, starting with the Reception cohort. All other year groups will remain at 60 as they move through the school.
